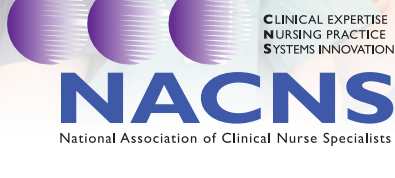


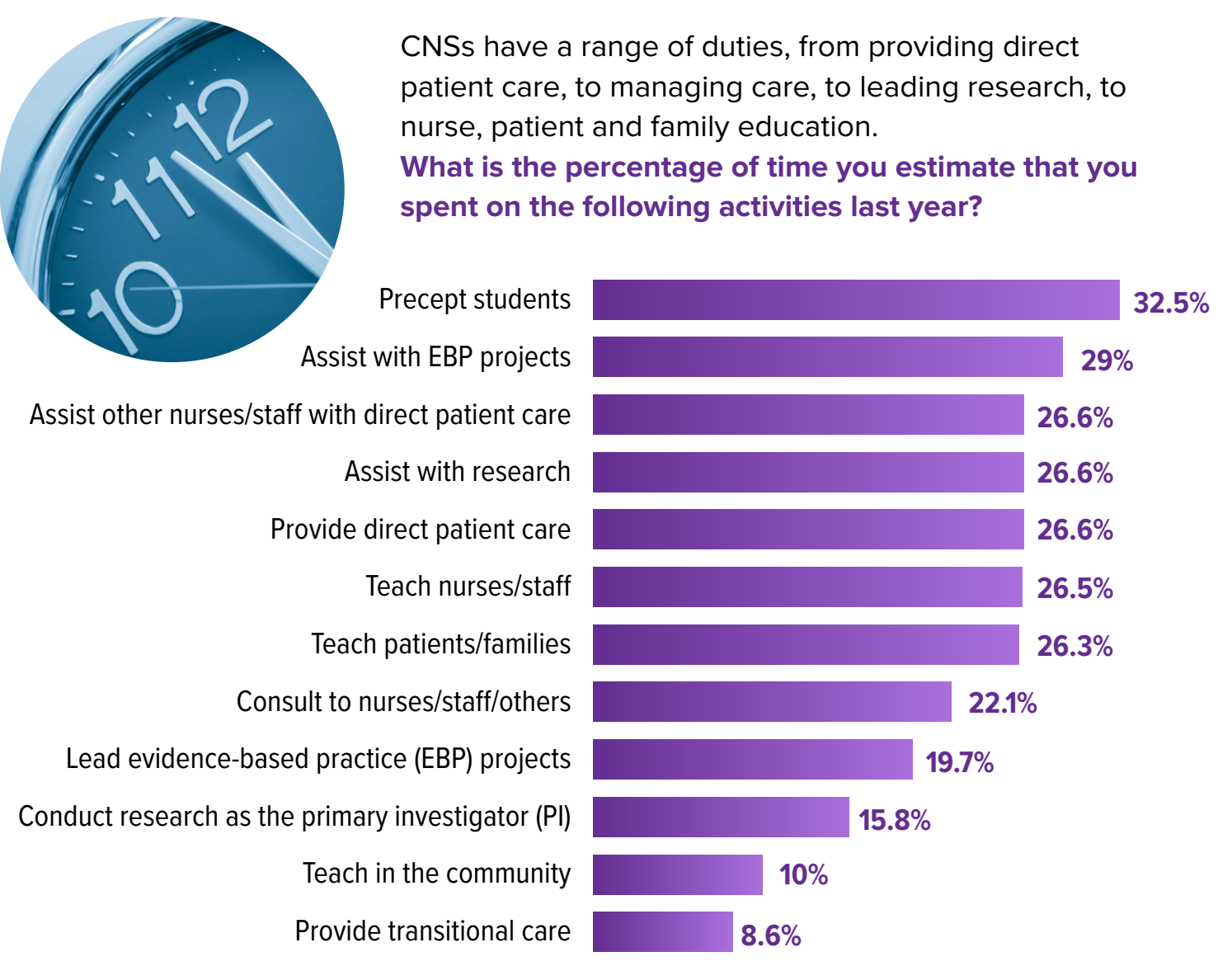
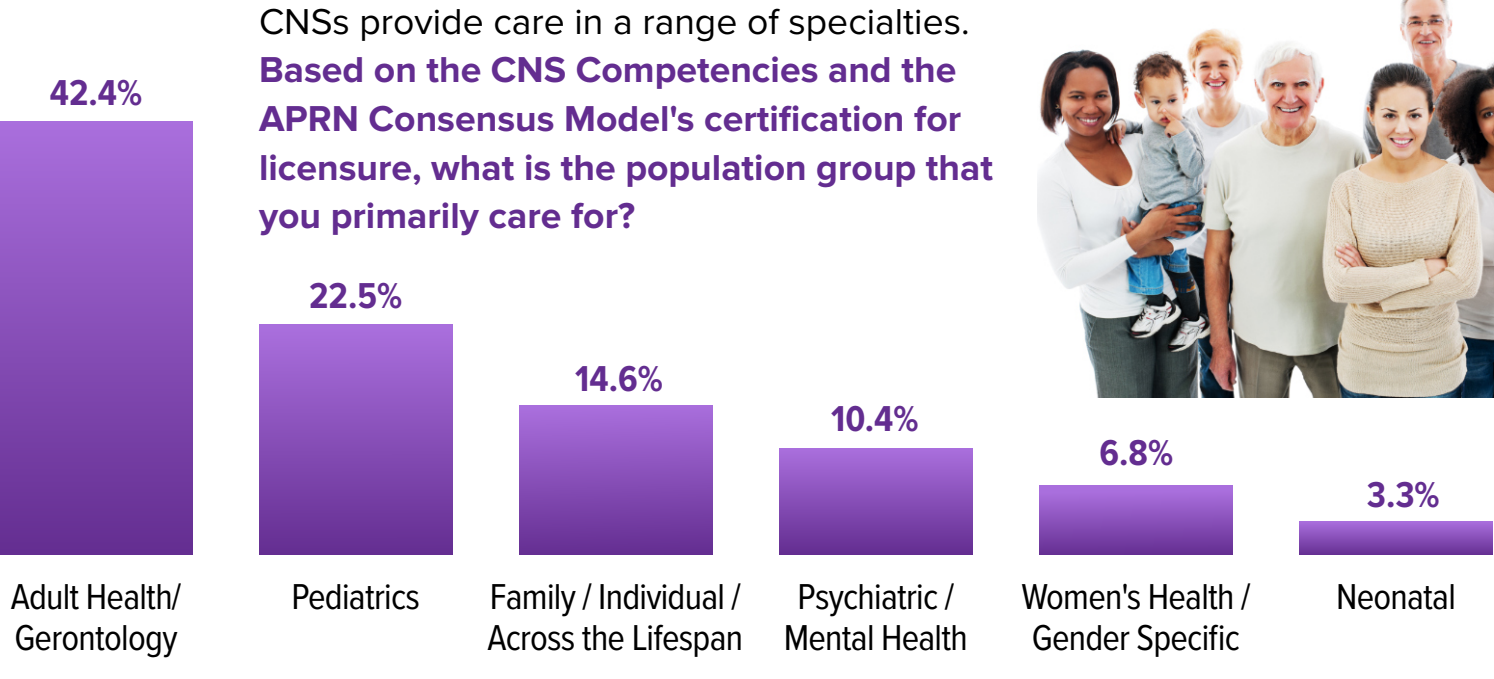


The Role of the CNS: Findings from the 2020 Census

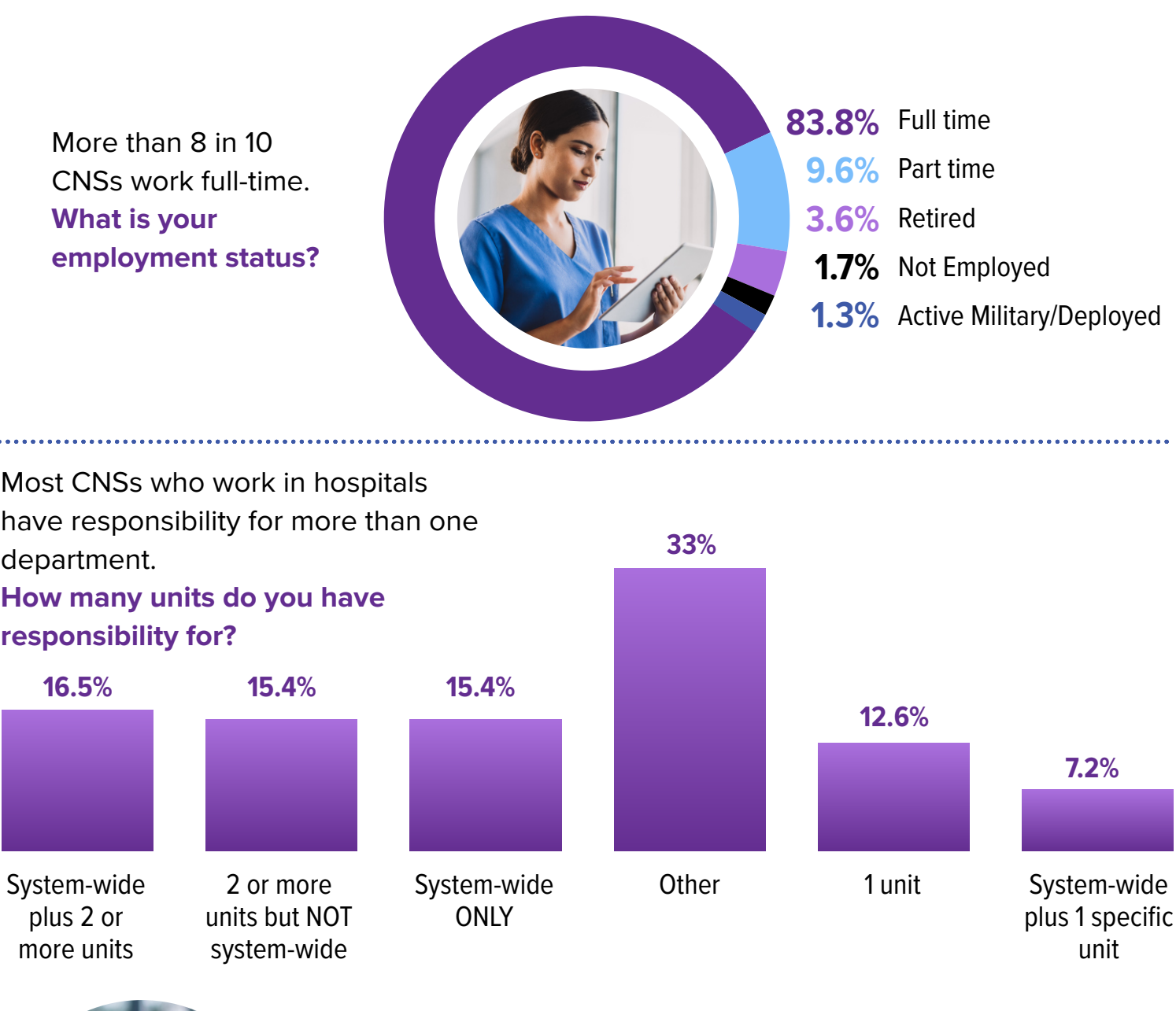

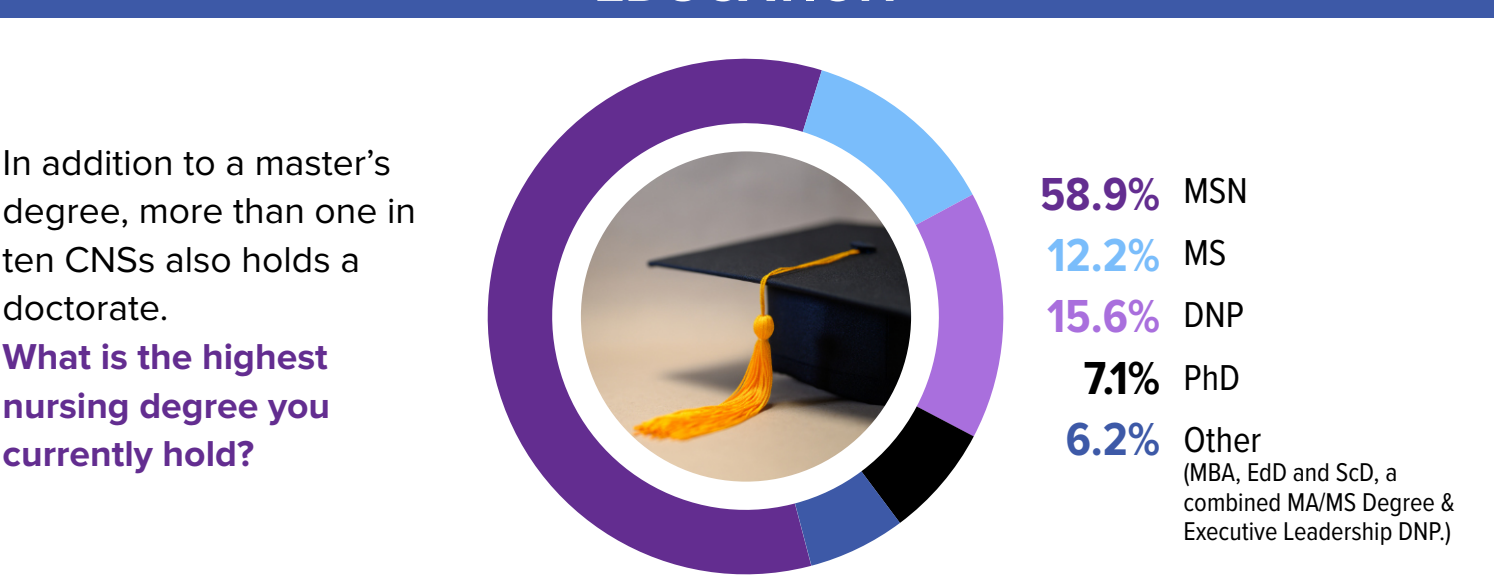
For CNSs who responded Other, there are many dynamic practice roles that were identified. These include responsibility for patients in one or more service lines that are population focus related such as heart failure, stroke, and chest pain units. Many CNSs have responsibility for one unit, but often take the lead on system wide projects or oversight of system wide programs like a Stroke program, New Graduate RN Residency Program, Research Projects, or a Magnet Designation. CNSs also work in ambulatory settings like Anticoagulation Clinics, Bariatric or Infusion Centers, Pediatric Diabetes Center, or in-Home Clinical Care Programs.



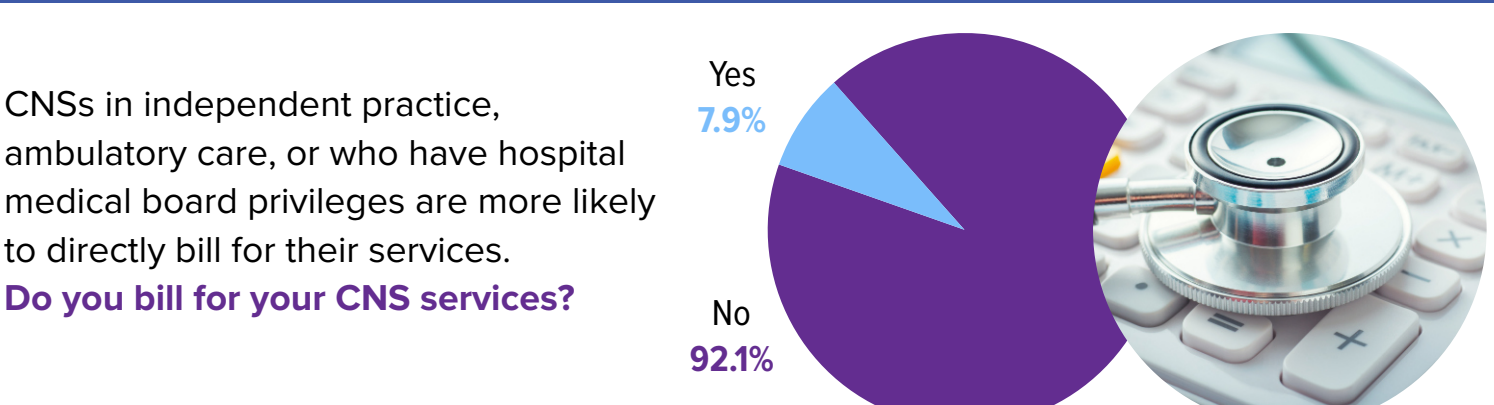

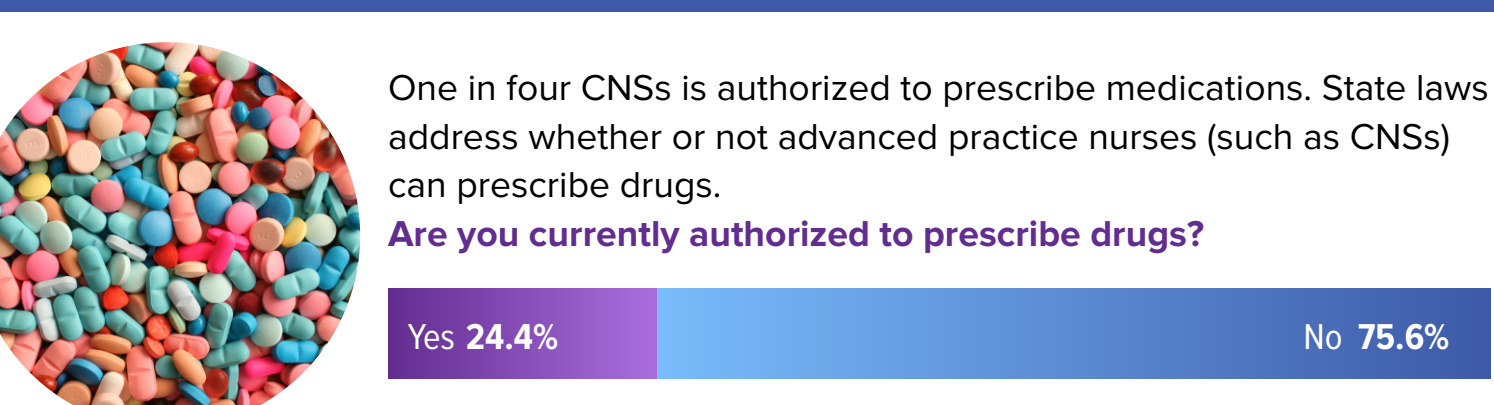
