Proposal from Tracey Kunac: Since there is no conference or forum next year I propose that we set up a term deposit to invest \$40,000.00 for 12 months.
General discussion ensued – general costs for running the Society are less than \$1,000.00 per year so feasible to put the rest into term deposit. For Tracey to discuss best terms with the bank manager including when current term deposit is due.
Proposal to deposit \$40,000.00 into term deposit was accepted unanimously by those present.
Financial report was unanimously accepted by those present.
